THE ENGLISH HORSE


These horses are ridden in English attire. This can include a snaffle bit, an English style saddle. The rider is usually in a hunt cap, hunter coat, breeches and tall boots.



SPORT HORSE IN-HAND

These classes evaluate a horse's suitability as a sport horse according to movement, conformation and general impression. Horses are judged 40 percent on movement, 40 percent on conformation, 10 percent on expression, manners and willingness and 10 percent on quality, balance and harmony.

Pleasure Driving horses are shown in a light show harness with blinkers, overcheck or side check. Either a two- or four-wheeled vehicle may be used.





FUN FACTS ABOUT ARABIAN HORSES

- 1** Arabian horses are known as the oldest pure breed of horse in the world
- 2** The Bedouins prized their horses so much that they used to let their Arabian horses sleep with them in their tents
- 3** The Bedouins preferred mares as their war mounts
- 4** The Purebred Arabian horse only comes in certain coat colors: Bay, black, grey, and chestnut
- 5** The Arabian horse can have one less vertebrae than other breeds
- 6** The Arabian horse's compact bodies give them balance and strength which is why they excel in almost every sport
- 7** The skin of an Arabian horse is black except under white pigment; the dark pigment protected the horse under the harsh desert sun
- 8** The Arabian horse's average weight is 1,000 pounds and height is between 14.2 and 15.2 hands (one hand = four inches) at the withers
- 9** Three Arabian stallions gave rise to the majority of all modern thoroughbred bloodlines
- 10** Some historic people that loved and rode Arabian horses were George Washington, Alexander the Great, Genghis Khan, and Ulysses S. Grant
